Greetings Cursillistas. As I am writing this, I am getting ready to enter a new phase in my life. Some people call this phase "retirement". We have to trust that we have prepared ourselves for what may lie ahead and we have to trust that God will provide. Walter will have copies of our next lay presentation book on hand for \$10.00 each. We have chosen "Rescued" by Fr. John Ricardo.


We will have the hot water & coffee on.
