Spiritual Advisor

My dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

I have had a very Spirit filled summer. I spent a week at the Franciscan University **Priest, Deacon, Seminarian Retreat** in June. Fr John Reccardo an ACTSXXIX Team were the presenters of a very powerful theme: "Speak Lord, Your Servant is Listening" The week revolved around four basic questions to ponder and soulfully consider. — Father God, by what name do you call me? Do you know me? - Jesus, lovingly reveals the one thing that keeps me from wholeheartedly following you. — Lord, expose for me, the enemy's primary strategy to wreck my life. And, — Lord Jesus, make known to me the most important thing to focus on RIGHT NOW.

The week was about how to rediscover the true Mission that Jesus entrusted to us in this changing culture, moving from "maintenance to Mission" from Christendom to Christianity and being equipped for mission and leadership for

the Church and the World today. Our Cursillo Movement is all about doing this transition as well.

My second event was the **Magnificat Conference** in Tampa, Florida for a weekend in July. It was hot, yes but we were in side most of the time, except to go out to warm up from the air-conditioning. This weekend too had some powerful talks about demonstrating and using our Gifts of the Holy Spirit in the Magnificat meetings, witnessing our faith and encouraging our mission to bring others (women from families and parishes) together.

Then during that week I had the privilege of the **Encounter Conference** in downtown Toledo. Some 4,000 people attended the three day event, 200 priests from all over the country and world, religious sisters and seminarians. I met several folks from Australia, Slovakia, Canada, South America, the Caribbean Islands, as well as from all over the USA. Imagine that, right here in Toledo, Ohio. The Holy Spirit was definitely breathing on us.

The Ministry to Catholic Charismatic Renewal offered a Life in the Spirit

Seminar at Maria Stein Retreat Center on the weekend of August 8,9 and 10. We had 35 participants plus the team. There are seven talks given during the weekend with breakout prayer groups following each session. The basic Kerygma is shared (like John Riccardo's Rescue book), God's love; Salvation; New Life in Christ: Receiving God's Gifts; Receiving the Baptism of the Holy Spirit; Growth in the

Gifts of the Holy Spirit; and Transformation of yourself and your environment.

Obviously there are any number of topics that could be shared but the one that came to mind was a common but simple gesture we all do at church and can easily be done in our home. That simple gesture is blessing ourselves with holy water and/or blest salt. This practice goes way back in our Jewish ancestry history with the recitation of the Shema.

Shema: (lit. "hear"); the daily declaration of faith, recited in the morning and evening prayers and before retiring for the night. "Hear oh Israel you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind." A mezuzah (מְדוּוּדָה) is a parchment scroll, on which the Shema is handwritten. It is mounted on the right side of the doorpost of a Jewish home reminds us of God and our heritage. It also invites God's watchful care over the home. A kosher mezuzah on the doors of a home or office protects the inhabitants — whether they are inside or outside.

When we come into a Catholic church the first thing is to bless ourselves with the holy water, to both remind ourselves of our baptism (that we are recreated by God in his image and likeness and filled with His Holy Spirit) and that by baptism we have a right to be in the church, we belong there. When we leave, besides the celebrant's final blessing, the water can remind us that we are on mission to bring the Good News of Jesus to all we meet in the coming week and to BE a blessing and Eucharist to all we meet.

A holy water font by our door at home can remind us of the same thing. We are blessed and are called to be a blessing to our world by bringing Christ into our daily environments. We can bless ourselves and one another, spouses and children. We can also anoint our senses for the daily mission: our forehead, that our thoughts may be holy; our eyes, that we may see Christ in everyone we meet; our ears, that we may hear and truly listen to one another and for God's voice; our heart that we may experience God's love and share our love for him and others we meet during the day. Our hands that we may do good work and service for others; finally our feet, that we may always walk in the ways of the Lord.

Upon coming home we can repeat this anointing just as a reminder that the Lord was with us all day through and we can be thankful for His guidance.

You can use a little font or just a dish with holy water in it. Also, blessed salt, if you want. There is always holy water available for home use in our churches.

As we use this sacramental, a simple gesture, the mindfulness of God's blessings through the day can make a real difference in our lives and in the lives of all we meet on any given day. After all we are a Sacrament and Eucharist for the world.

"Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not men, knowing that from the Lord you will receive the inheritance as your reward." Colossians 3:23

This verse reminds me of days I was extremely frustrated with my job, the office I worked in, and my fellow co-workers. Being the only Catholic Christian, and possibly the only Christian, and seeing people's attitudes and treatment of fellow employees, it was difficult to stay and not simply walk out and away from that toxic environment. Some days I wondered why I kept going back, other than the need for my paycheck.

My drive home was a peaceful drive through the country, which often helped defuse my emotions and attitude. I always had Christian music playing on the radio, and I tried to get a rosary in either on the way to or on the way home from work. These things also helped me keep believing that God had a plan for me and that I was where I was supposed to be for a reason. It wasn't up to me to question God, but to trust him.

I had to remind myself "who" I was really, ultimately, working for. Yes, I was entering orders, calling drivers, and talking to customers. But as I was doing so, how I did my job and how I treated people who were on the other end of the line or there in the office is what mattered most. I was to be God's hands and feet, his voice and his Spirit to everyone, wasn't I? I had to remember I was working for God, not the man whose name was on the sign on the building. My work for the Kingdom was the most important work entrusted to me!

It wasn't easy. But once I started "working heartily for the Lord and not for men" and giving the rest to God, things became much more tolerable. I prayed for my co-workers and the customers daily. I put yellow sticky notes on my computer screen with bible verses to help keep me focused on the most important boss of all, God!

We hope to see you at the Holy Hour for the men's weekend on Saturday, September 6 at 8:00 pm in the Chapel across from the Spirituality Center. It will be followed by the serenade at 9:00 pm.


