Dear Friends.

The start of team meetings for upcoming Cursillo weekends (after a long hiatus), gives us all an opportunity to renew our commitment to prayer, study, and action. Hopefully, we've never overlooked this three-legged stool that can provide such a solid platform upon which to grow and thrive. In these very unsettling times that unleash both fear and anger in us and around us, this Cursillo method can keep us on the path that Jesus points out. I'd like to share a few ways this has been true for me, with hopes that you will find your way to apply this tripod to your life.

The Black Lives Matter movement these past 18+ months has challenged me to examine my own biases and prejudices. I decided to do some study. I read books like "White Fragility" by Robin DeAngelo and "Caste: The Origins of our Discontents" by Isabel Wilkerson and I attended a workshop to sensitize myself to the issues faced by people of color in our country. We who are Caucasian do have an unfair advantage over others that makes us think we are a superior race – probably not consciously, but implicitly. We define what is acceptable and "normal" in terms of language, customs, food, family traditions, worship, art and music, holidays, economic and academic success, work ethic... and so on.

When we meet a different cultural value system, we may initially back off in wonder, but sometimes that degenerates into negative judgment. What is needed is STUDY. I then approach an issue with a desire to discover, with an openness to learn... and what I learn is that the issue is both more complex and more simple than I had originally judged it to be. Getting to know and appreciate people who have different backgrounds can enrich my life in marvelous ways and deepen my appreciation and compassion for all God's children. Study takes me beyond the limitation of my opinions and fears.

I am also very conscious of and personally affected by the political divisiveness that is tearing apart families, long-time friends, our communities, and our country. It is tempting to align ourselves with those who think similarly and label the others disparagingly. Here is an area for ACTION that can be practiced every day.

I can stop arguing my point of view as though it is the absolute truth and actually listen to an alternate viewpoint, with a desire to understand, thus moving the interaction from a debate to a meaningful conversation, wherein both parties (hopefully) are seeking understanding and direction. I can remind myself that social media are platforms for self-expression but not necessarily objective truth, so I'm not going to rely on such sources for factual accuracy. I'm going to give people the benefit of the doubt that, although they may have a different value system, they are not thereby uninformed, stupid, naïve, misguided or evil people. Goodness is planted in each one of us by the God who created us. If I have a strong, assertive personality, I will speak my opinions more tentatively and if I have a more retiring personality, I will add my piece of truth to the conversation with more courage – but neither with a superior attitude, for truth is many-faceted before it becomes simple.

I am also very troubled by a similar divisiveness growing in faith communities, certainly in the Catholic Church, but in most other Christian denominations as well. It is a sad commentary if we know more about what each political party stands for than what the Gospel stands for. I know too many priests and deacons who are afraid to preach the challenging words of the Gospel for fear that their parishioners will accuse them of being "too political." They are charged at their ordination to believe, teach, and live the Gospel. Who is at fault when they are intimidated, ridiculed, or punished for doing so? Obviously, this is a great need for PRAYER. Daily prayer and meditation on the life and teaching of Jesus, with a heart open to conversion, is the only real way to learn that neither political party aligns perfectly with the Gospel. So, what will I choose to be the guiding light in my life??? Hmmmm...

Prayer, Study and Action: they really all intertwine, don't they? Let's redouble our efforts at all three. Heaven knows, we need this three-legged stool in our lives... and our many environments are also crying out for the relief they can bring.
