Make a Friend – Be A Friend – Bring a Friend to Christ

Cursillo

God so greatly blessed the Fall Cursillos. With fellowship and love, the absolute presence of His Holy Spirit and with the presence of our dear gentle, sweet friend John Reinhart. It is impossible to fill this space with any words, but hopefully and prayerfully Karen and Dany and Amanda and all their family know how very much they are loved and prayed for as they journey through their sorrow.

At the beginning of the pandemic -- when we were unable to attend Mass, receive the Holy Eucharist -- or spend time with Jesus in adoration -- my mind continued to be drawn back to this reflection. A professor used it as a meditation to close her Piety Rollo many years ago. It is a poor reflection on my organizational and housekeeping skills - to say it has taken me 1-1/2 years to find it! Only Jesus and St. Anthony know how I finally came upon it. As we also reflect on John's going to Jesus -- I hope it might bring to mind how great is the gift of the Eucharist and the gift of each of our places in the beautiful and holy Body of Christ. It was so powerfully witnessed at his funeral. We know, too, that in the last couple of months it has become so painfully apparent to us that Christians are suffering brutally in the Middle East for their love of Jesus. Here is the reflection.

"The missionary returned to China for a visit. He had previously served there for 40 years. Because of the problems existing in China, no one knew that he was a priest. On the second night of his visit, he was awakened in the middle of the night by the noise of people moving about the house. A little frightened, he got up out of bed and went to the door. Opening his door, he asked a man living in the building what was going on. The Chinese man replied, "We're going to the wall." He inquired further, "What is the wall?" The Chinese man replied, "Come with us and we will show you."

There were many people living in the house and while none of them knew that he was a priest, they knew he could be trusted. Not satisfied with the answers he had received, he went downstairs and found one of the older ladies whom he had known from 40 years earlier and asked her, "What's going on? Where are you all going?" She gently replied, "We're going to the wall." He persisted, "What is the wall?" She replied with the same gentleness, "Come with us and we will show you." He got dressed and ventured out into the night with this group of people; walking for miles -- and then they were joined by two other groups until they numbered 120.

They came to a forest and before long they came to a clearing. There in the middle of the clearing was a small half-built wall left from an old building. The old woman turned to him and smiled with all the love she had in her heart. He looked up to notice that there was a circle of men from their group surrounding the clearing in the trees above. The group walked into the clearing -- walked toward the wall -- and fell down on their knees before the wall.

Moments later, one man got up and walked toward the wall. Reaching forward with one hand, he took one brick out of the wall and behind that brick was reserved the Blessed Sacrament. They adored the Blessed Sacrament for one hour in silent prayer. Then the same man got up and approached the wall. He replaced the single brick. The men came down from the trees and they went home. The next day he told them that he was a priest and he in turn was told that they had not celebrated Mass in 10 years and that the host that had been hidden in the wall had been there for 10 years. Two or three times a week, they would go to the wall in the middle of the night, risking their lives to spend one hour with Jesus, their greatest friend. The priest said Mass at the wall the next night and replaced the host.

Do we appreciate Jesus in the tabernacle? If discovered that evening, those 120 people would have been imprisoned and quite possible killed. You and I can visit Jesus freely whenever we desire. We don't have to risk our lives. Jesus is our greatest friend. He has all the answers, and He is waiting for us in the Blessed Sacrament -- as He has waited for 2000 years."
