On that cold, windy, wet evening, Francis ministered to the entire world.

Since that blessing, the Holy Father has consistently reminded us that we must strive to remain connected with each other and that we must work together to come through a terrible time of world pandemic. He has called on world leaders to work together to find creative solutions to the economic and emotional toll brought about by necessary shutdowns.

Over the past year, Pope Francis has urged us to love God and to love our neighbor as ourselves. More than any religious or political leader, Francis recognizes and warns us that the world will not "go back to normal" after Covid 19 is brought under control because the virus has exposed the selfishness of the culture in which we live.


And it is a good time to pray for the family members and loved ones of those who did not survive the virus, and to remember the love and care they shared with us.

Pre-Cursillo

As you read this ARK, we will be in the Sacred Triduum and Easter season. This is my favorite time in the liturgical year. There is so much symbolism as we come to the end of Lent and enter the Easter season.

On the Fifth Sunday of Lent, in my parish, we shroud all the statues and the crucifixes in purple. This is a tradition that I remember growing up but has not been used as much over the years. Our pastor explained it as a type of fasting from all the beauty in our churches as we prepare for Easter. Even though I helped to put up the purple cloths, when I walked into church on that Sunday morning, it still startled me, making me think of how I would spend the last two weeks of Lent.

Holy Week and all the celebrations each have a special meaning. The reading of the Passion on Palm Sunday prepares me to walk with Jesus throughout Holy Week. The Sacred Triduum, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday allow us to walk with Jesus through his passion, death, and resurrection. Holy Thursday and the remembrance of the Last Supper, then the procession with the Eucharist at the end of

Mass, the stripping of the altar, all touch me in different ways, again remembering what Jesus is about to go through. The reading of the Passion again on Good Friday, and the veneration of the cross can move me to tears. Holy Saturday brings the Easter Vigil, the decorated church, the blessing of new fire and new Holy Water, the readings from creation to Jesus' resurrection that bring it all together. Witnessing the RCIA catechumens and candidates being brought into the Church brings such joy. Finally, the joy of Easter Sunday morning makes the sacrifices of Lent all worthwhile. Finally, we can say, "Alleluia, Jesus is truly risen!"

As we enter this Easter season, let us not forget about our Cursillo candidates, both those we have already asked, and hope to make the Fall weekends (keep praying), and those we have yet to ask. Now is the time to 'make a friend, be a friend, bring that friend to Christ'. Did you see someone in church over Easter that would make a good candidate? Don't be afraid to talk with them, they just might be interested.

School of Leaders Rector/Rectors needed!


