Dear Sisters and Brothers in the Lord.

My reflections come from my prayer regarding the Holy Thursday Service and ritual of Foot Washing. I was asked to celebrate a service on Holy Thursday at the long-term care center. I have a beautiful picture of Jesus washing the foot of Peter. As Jesus is leaning over the bowl one can see Jesus and Peter's face in the bowl. Peter's face is incredulous as to what Jesus is doing. Distraught, even how to handle this situation. Jesus, the Master, is caring for his friends, teaching them.

As I was praying over the text it dawned on me that those participating were all women and seniors in the aging process. I noted to the participants that in their earlier years they were always the ones caring for the needs of the folks around them. Most of them were mothers and grandmothers and friends. They took up the task of serving their loved ones. Graciously, I reminded them that they were the ones who took up the task without thinking about themselves. The smiles on their faces told the stories of their memories. Here we are today hearing that story and feeling like Peter who wanted to change places with Jesus so we could minister to Jesus, their Master. They had always been the ones serving. Now, in the aging process these beautiful women need to let another minister to them. These women understood in a new way the meaning of this passage. Jesus' example of caring service they had provided and now receive this care from their Master.

Somehow, as I reflected on this Scripture, and how poignant it was to this group, I reflected on how this can speak to each of us. As leaders in the Cursillo movement we have in the past and continue now to serve others in so many ways - through talks, rituals, Sacraments - we nourish, feed, teach candidates and one another in mind, body and spirit. We are reminded that we are called to serve but also to allow Jesus to minister to and through us. Let us thank Jesus and ask that we remain open to receive the grace to serve and to open us to receive His service and that of our brothers and sisters.





## Witness

To all of our Cursillo Friends.

Back on March 29, I was the intended victim of a scam attempt; thanks be to God I escaped the plot. I would like to share my experience in the hope that it might save others from this horrible experience.



At about 9:30 A.M. I answered the phone and was greeted with this message. Hello Grampa, this is your grandson Tyler, and I'm in big trouble; (his voice full of desperation) I've been in *an accident and hit* another car driven by a six months pregnant woman who was taken to the hospital for injuries. I got a broken nose and a busted lip and I am under arrest and I'm in big trouble and I need your help. So write these things down; you need to contact the Public Defender at this phone number (which I wrote down) and ask for Adam Wiese to help me. And then, "I gotta go, I gotta go!" Click (hang up) and dial tone. So I immediately called that number, Adam answered and filled me in on what had transpired. Here is his story; Tyler was distracted by and had reached for his cell phone and he rear ended another car, and the driver suffered a broken collar bone, her six month term pregnancy was jeopardized.

Tyler was being held by the county sheriff's office and had been treated for his injuries. Also his cell phone had been confiscated. Tyler didn't want this to be publicized and he would have to be held overnight until bail could be arranged. He was being in an area of the jail not in contact with the rest of the prisoners. Mister Wiese told me I had to come up with \$14,700 cash to obtain Tyler's release the next morning and asked me if I could come up with that money. I said I would try. He said I should call him on his cell phone and gave his number to use after I had obtained the money.

I told Pat this nasty news and we both were extremely upset. I prepared to run into town and she insisted that she wanted to come along with me. So we got into the car, backed out of the garage and started going down the lane. I told Pat before we go any farther I want to call our sheriff's dept. to verify the story that I had received. I stopped the car and made the call. The accident was supposed to have happened in Bellevue so Fremont called Bellevue police and found that no such accident had happened that morning. Then we talked some more with the sheriff's staff and they told us that our case was almost certainly a scam and told us to try to contact Tyler on the phone. So we punched in the number and the sweetest we ever heard said "hi Grampa I'm at work, why are you calling me?" It was a youthful voice full of vigor unbothered by the problems that we had been told had befallen him. I briefly told him that someone was trying to scam us and he replied that he would call us right after work to hear the details. After Pat and I had finished bawling and praising the Lord, Pat said, let's just drive over to St. Mary's and visit the Blessed Sacrament and we did just that!

The internet has huge amounts of personal information available and crooks who are determined can learn enough to bilk people especially older folks like ourselves and rob them blind. I believe that my guardian angel gave me the thought and the insight that saved the day and saved us from a big mistake. May God bless all of you! Thankfully yours! ---
